Weather today:

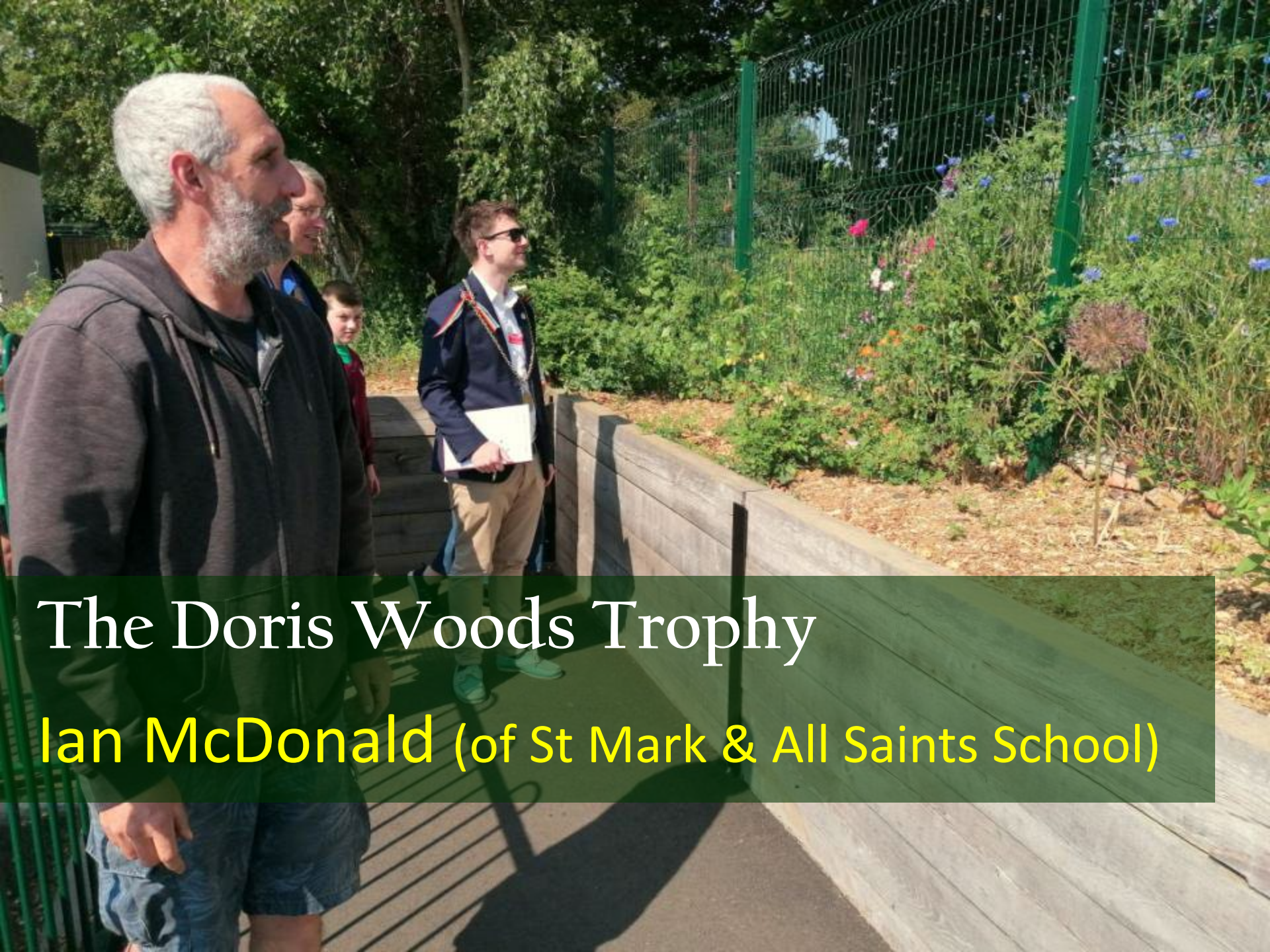

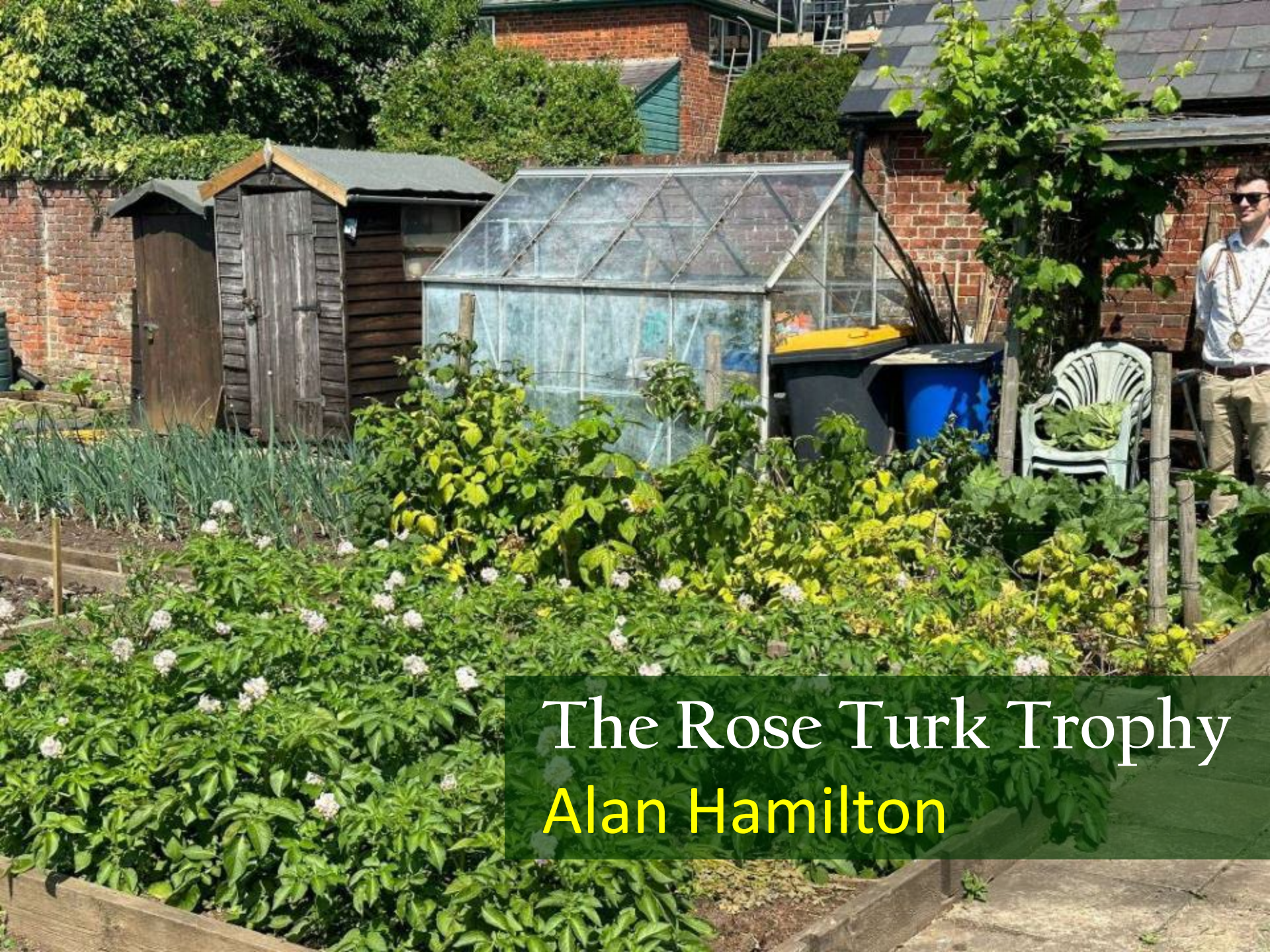
